
Ohio Chapter GOOF (Gathering Of Ohio Faithful), August 21-24, 2025

We're pleased to announce all of the details for the Ohio Chapters GOOF for 2025. It will be held in West Central Ohio, in and around the City of Bellefontaine, Thursday, Aug. 21 to Sunday, Aug. 24 (please note the **Thursday** start—more below!). Make your hotel reservation by **July 21**; please register for the event itself

by **Aug. 6**. This event is now a NAMGAR Regional Event, officially recognized by the North American MGA Register as a courtesy to our BuckAyes, a NAMGAR chapter!

Our host hotel will be the brand-new Cobblestone Inn & Suites in Bellefontaine, Ohio (it just opened June 20). A group room block has been secured with discounted rates: \$149 on Thursday, \$169 for Friday/Saturday. This includes full breakfast and King or Double Queen rooms, are available at this rate. Branded as "Big City Quality, Small Town Values," the hotel has Wi-Fi, an indoor pool, fire pit

About the Hill Climb! The GOOF is being planned in conjunction with the increasingly popular Bellefontaine Hill Climb Revival. Now in its 7th year, the BHCR is held annually at Zanesfield's Corkscrew Hill, near Bellefontaine. It is well-planned and executed by chaptermembers Kurt Niemeyer and Laura Zappia. *Many will remember Kurt or his parents as*

members, or, unfortunately, for the horrible fire which burned their family car collection near Cincinnati in 2020. Kurt and Laura own Sports Car Preservation Ltd. in Milford.

Kurt's event re-lives the glory days of sports car hill climb racing, when the Bellefontaine Hill Climb was the longest running public road competition in Ohio (held from 1953-1974). The Hill Climb Revival drives the same original historic course and is open to cars manufactured prior to 1985 or select others with approval. No specialized preparation is required, though each car must display a number 8" high, 6" wide with a 1" stroke to pass safety



inspection and get on the course, if competing (not needed for our parade lap). Experience in competition, including Autocross, Rally or Racing is required to formally enter the racing event, but not to participate in our GOOF. (Cars racing will be classified as "Production" (stock), "Modified;" or "Full Race" and are broken into sub classes by engine displacement.) If you wish to enter the Hill Climb separately (not required as part of our event, please do so at:

ONLY need to register for the Hill Climb if you plan to RACE competitively on Saturday, not for our event.



The Ohio Chapters will be financially sponsoring several aspects of the Hill Climb in order to support Kurt and the event. As part of our combining the GOOF with the race weekend, we will be tagging on to all of the events associated with the hill climb. This is why we are starting our event on Thursday this will give us time to enjoy the area on our own and still fully support the BHCR7 event.

Schedule for the GOOF:



Thursday, August 21st

2:45 – Arrive directly at Honda Heritage Center, 24025 Honda Pkwy, Marysville, OH 43040. No need to go to the hotel, go straight to Honda. We will have supper immediately after, then go to the hotel for check-in. Please arrive just before the museum closes to the public at 3:00. We will then have almost 90 minutes, just for our group.

The Honda Heritage Center features products and displays that focus on Honda's U.S. engineering and manufacturing presence that started in Central Ohio in 1979. Explore the varied exhibits to learn more about Honda history and the products designed, engineered and manufactured in America. Honda has become an American leader in mobility, including the Honda and Acura



automobile brands, powersports and power equipment products, marine engines, and even a jet airplane, while continuing to innovate for the future. Learn about this rich history through a self-guided tour including narrated videos, photos and displays. See classic Honda automobiles and learn about Honda's earliest beginnings in the U.S., selling three models of small capacity motorcycles out of a small office in Los Angeles starting in 1959. Then, in 1979, becoming the first Japanese manufacturer to build motorcycles in America, followed in 1983 by being the first to build

cars stateside, with both manufacturing facilities located northwest of

Marysville, Ohio.

4:30 - Depart for Supper Location.

4:45 – Shared supper with Central Ohio MG Owners (COMGO) at **The Old Stone Haus Tavern**, 18966 Main Street, Broadway, OH 43007. (If you GPS it, you will get 18966 Main Street, Raymond, OH—it is the same location.) Old Stone Haus is a Broadway landmark. Built in 1896 as a hardware and general store; enjoy the atmosphere! We will have a side room off the bar. Order and pay on your own. Prices are reasonable.

7:00-ish – Travel to and Check-in at the Cobblestone Hotel, 171

Dowell Avenue, Bellefontaine, OH 43311 (near the intersection of

U.S. Route 33 and U.S. Route 68). Travel the highway or there will be a scenic route provided.

Until 10:00 – Welcome Reception in the hospitality room at the hotel, graciously sponsored by **NAMGAR**, the North American MGA Register! Enjoy refreshments, games and socializing.

Friday, August 22nd

7-9:00 - Full breakfast at hotel, included. 9:10 - Driver's Meeting; cover the day's events.

9:20 – Depart for morning activities. A beautiful country drive is planned to the unique car collection of Bob McConnell at **Gaslight Auto Parts**, 1445 U.S. Route 68, Urbana, OH 43078. Afterwards will be local history and lore; local 911 Memorial, America's shortest street, First Concrete Street, typical Smittle-planned stuff.



11:30 – Grimes Flying Lab Museum, 1636 North Main St., Urbana, OH 43078. Dedicated to preserving the historic Grimes Flying Lab Beech 18 aircraft from the Grimes Manufacturing Co. History: Warren Grimes was the father of



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aircraft lighting—Henry Ford approached Grimes in the mid-1920s to produce lights for the Ford Tri-Motor, the "Tin Goose." In 1933, Grimes Manufacturing developed and provided wing-tip navigation lights for WACO planes in nearby Troy and in 1936 received a patent for an electric-powered retractable landing light. During WW II, nearly all American aircraft had Grimes lighting. In the 1950s, the Grimes Flying Lab, a modified Beech 18, was used to test and demonstrate new lighting technologies. By 1962, Grimes was making more than 3,000 lights and by 1970 there was virtually no airplane flying in the free world which did not contain Grimes lighting. The

plane was restored by the Foundation in 2008; we'll see it and the museum.

12:30 – **Lunch** at Grimes Field, 1636 N Main St, Urbana, OH 43078. Lunch on-your-own at **Mindy's Airport Café**, next door. Indoor and outdoor seating is available.

1:30 – Depart for afternoon activities back to Bellefontaine culminating at the Logan County Transportation Museum, behind 521 East Columbus Avenue, Bellefontaine, OH 43311. www.loganhistory.org We will visit McKinley Street, the "Shortest Street in America". At just 20 feet long, it connects West Columbus and Garfield Avenues. (It was once the shortest street in the world but that distinction now belongs to Ebenezer Place in Scotland.) We will also visit Court Avenue, the oldest concrete street in America. Constructed in 1891, it was an experimental project using concrete paving, a novel idea at the time. The street is located next to the Logan County Courthouse and remains in use today, though restricted to light use traffic and parking.

2:30 – For the rest of the afternoon, we will support the events of the Bellefontaine Hill Climb Revival weekend... Race participants will be gathering for the safety inspection on the cars for Saturday's racing events. The Logan County Museums are



free for the day; they have a wonderful collection. Members of the community will come at this time to see the cars up close. We will take turns having members in the parking lot to talk to the kids and families about the cars while others are able to tour the museums.

5:00 – Our **Banquet** will be held immediately following the tech inspections, **on-site**, in the atrium of the Transportation Museum! Designed to mimic a locomotive roundhouse, the transportation museum is where we will hold our club banquet, with awards, etc. (We are, again, having an early supper, then will return to the hotel after the banquet. There is no need to return to the hotel to change clothes, etc.; we're just powering through



the day!) We are having an **Amish-family** cater our dinner. It will be at a lower cost than a usual banquet. (Since the hotel is more expensive this time, I'm keeping costs lower for the rest of the weekend.) Our Saturday night meal will be part of the BHCR7-scheduled events, so Friday night will be our "usual" awards banquet. The banquet will be catered by Nancy & Marvin Helmuth. The menu will include: roast beef, roast pork, mashed potatoes and gravy, green beans, noodles, 7-layer salad, dinner rolls, tea, lemonade, coffee and water, with peanut butter cream, peach, apple and cherry pies. The cost for dinner will be \$29, includes gratuity and the cost of the Helmuth's transportation and to tip their driver who will be transporting them and the food to and from the museum that day.

7:30-ish – Return to Cobblestone Hotel, 171 Dowell Avenue, Bellefontaine, OH 43311.

Optional. 7:40 Leave for Campbell Hill via Ohio State Route 47 (a scenic 7 min. drive).

Optional. 8:00-9:15 Private tour of the new National Air Defense Radar Museum. Dedicated to the service of the former 664th Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron (AC&W), a unit of the U.S. Air Force assigned to the Bellefontaine Air Force Station, the museum is now housed in the former AN/FPS-26 tower on top of Campbell Hill which held the rotating radar antenna, sans the radome protective structures. Managed by a dedicated group of volunteers who served at the Bellefontaine Air Force Base, we will have a personally narrated tour of the new museum, equipment and historical artifacts by the museum curator.



Until 10:00 – Hospitality room open; snacks, refreshments, games, fun.

Saturday, August 23rd

[For those able to volunteer for the Hill Climb event, Kurt will need help to set-up the course and grounds. I said we would assist—please consider volunteering if you are able. The following times are for those who volunteer.]

[6-6:30] – Full breakfast at hotel for those volunteering, included in room rate.

[6:45] – **Volunteers** report to **Goshen Friends Church**, 5527 County Road 153, Zanesfield, OH 43360. It is a 10-minute drive via U.S. Route 33. The church ladies will also have coffee and donuts. There will be lots of scurrying around to prepare for the event as it takes shape for the day. We will have designated GOOF parking in the paddock for the day.

For everyone else, the following times apply...

6-9:00 – **Full breakfast** at hotel, included in room rate. See below* for ladies' activities for the day. We have hired a dedicated shuttle bus and driver all day; no being stuck at the hill!

9:30 – Group 1 Races. Details about what races and cars in which groups will be provided on-site.

11:00 – Group 2 Races.

12:30 – **Group 3 Parade Laps** will be held while the race volunteers have lunch break. This is us! *Group 3 will be dedicated to giving all enthusiasts and fans the opportunity to drive Corkscrew Hill as a Parade Lap following the pace car. This will be complimentary for our group, you do not need to*



register separately for it. You can do more than one lap (3 max.). Anyone in our group can do this. The Parade Lap means non-competitively driving your car up the Hillclimb hill, around and down the return roads and back to the base of the hill (following the Pace Car).

1:30 – Group 3 Races.

3:00 – Group 4 Races.

Per Kurt, "Corkscrew Hill opportunities: For parade laps during Group 3, we can position the All-British Run Group as either 2 or 4. Each run group takes a "Reconnaissance Lap" behind the pace car on the way to the grid. We could have the Ohio Chapter follow the British cars on the Recon lap. Part of the fun of the event is the number of spectators that congregate in yards and driveways to watch the cars make their way back to the base of the hill. We can have an MG Corral at the back of the active grid for MGs to park during the All British Run."

***9:30 a.m.** – Board the shuttle bus at the hotel for ladies' activities for the day. This is for those who may not wish to go to the hill.

The shuttle bus is limited to 14 passengers, so it will make circular trips to accommodate transportation between the hotel, the hill and downtown. Options may include: Logan Co. Coffee Trail Passport (also, Ice Cream Trail or Pizza Trail passports--get



stamps/win a prize), CVB-provided "Girls Day Out" or "Shop 'Til you Drop" suggested itineraries will be provided for Downtown Bellefontaine. The city—named one of the best downtowns in Ohio—is known for its shopping, breweries, smoothies, BBQ, ice cream, candies, antiques, jewelry, spa, axethrowing, pottery, an escape room and a farmer's market (until Noon). There will be a scheduled return trip back to the hill so spouses can do the lunch-time Parade Laps in your car (as noted above). In the afternoon, it is suggested to use the bus to go to the Fall Open House weekend in the Village of West Liberty (small business specials, etc.) or for more fun around Bellefontaine. The bus will have a mandatory final trip back to the hill at 4:30 so the ladies can do the parade from the hill into town at the end of the day. Ohio Chapters will sponsor the shuttle bus but it is intended for all

who are interested, member or not. More details will be provided on-site but plan on this being a special and fun activity for the day for those who often occupy the passenger seat on these trips!

5:00 – **Parade of cars** from the hill into Downtown Bellefontaine. Reserved parking will be on the Square. Spouses should use the shuttle bus back to the hill to parade into town in your car, or, meet your spouse/car in town at the car show parking, north side of the courthouse.

5:30-8:30 – Car Show and Awards Party. Our supper tonight is to use the Hill Climb Hospitality ticket/Awards Party for our participants and cost \$30. The event is being catered by Six-Hundred Downtown, a fantastic local restaurant. Within a DORA district, alcoholic drinks can be carried among the cars on display on the square. Inside the historic Holland Theater is where the food and bar will be located. Awards of the day will be presented in the auditorium. We will have designated parking on the square.



Sunday, August 24th

7-9:00 – **Full breakfast** at hotel, included in room rate.

9-10:00 – **Board Meeting**, in Hospitality Room.

10:00 – Goodbyes and Departures. If time allows, consider visiting **Ohio Caverns**. Located SE of Bellefontaine, they are open at 9 a.m. Ohio Caverns, 2210 State Route 245, West Liberty, OH 43357. https://ohiocaverns.com There are many more neat things in the area to see and do than we had time for!

I hope you like the plans for the event and will attend. The **Registration Fee** for the event is \$50 per couple or \$30 for a single attendee.
